#### Training Fellowships for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Research

**Purpose:**

to provide support for research training or training leading to research in areas of particular relevance relating to the health and well being of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, at an Australian tertiary institution

**Eligibility Criteria:**

Graduates in all health-related fields. Priority will be offered to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. Offered to persons who wish to make Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Research a significant component of their career

**Value:**

Stipend \$61,000 pa (same as Level RO1 of NHMRC award) + \$5,000 research support + \$5,000 pa on costs and conference allowance

**Special Conditions:**

For up to 3 years

Awarded annually

### Indigenous Small Grants

**Purpose:**

To support initiatives that enhance youth participation or create opportunities for the development of Indigenous young people aged 12 to 25 years

**Eligibility Criteria:**

Non-profit organisations (including local government and schools) such as Indigenous organisations and organisations that work with Indigenous people and communities seeking to support innovation and the expansion of existing successful initiatives

**Value:**

up to \$5,000; average \$2,500

**Success Rate:**

12 awarded in 2005

### Healthway. Health Promotion Indigenous Research Training Scholarship

**Purpose:**

To support Indigenous postgraduate students to undertake research studies/training in areas of particular relevance to the promotion of health in Aboriginal communities, leading to a Graduate Diploma, Masters or a PhD, in WA. Priority research areas include: Alcohol & other drug misuse; Determinants of healthy behaviour; Good nutrition; Injury prevention; Mental health (including education in human relationships); Physical activity promotion; Sexual health (including HIV/STD's); Sun protection; Tobacco smoking control; Asthma prevention & control; Cancer prevention; Cardiovascular disease prevention; or Diabetes prevention

**Eligibility Criteria:**

Graduates who are of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent & will reside within Western Australia for the duration of the scholarship

**Value:**

Up to \$24,600pa stipend + allowances & \$4,000pa for host institution

**Special Conditions:**

For 1 year for Certificate/Diploma; 2 years for Masters; 3 years for PhD; anyone receiving any support from the tobacco industry or related organisations is ineligible

**Success Rate:**

1 awarded annually
